Junior 'Provisional' Licences

- Are only available to 'Juniors' aged 12 – 17 years old.
- Are valid for up to one calendar year only.
- Expire on 31 December in the year of issue.
- Each separate entitlement is available once only.
- Are free of charge.

Once a Junior Provisional Game Licence expires a junior must obtain a pass in the relevant test and apply for a general Game Licence before continuing to hunt duck or Sambar Deer with the use of hounds in Victoria.

Read this section before completing the Game Licence Application Form.

- In accordance with the *Wildlife (Game) Regulations 2012*, a Game Licence is required for hunters who wish to hunt Deer, Duck or Quail in Victoria. A Game Licence issued by the Game Management Authority (GMA) is valid in Victoria only. Refer to the GMA website www.gma.vic.gov.au for the latest information about hunting game species in Victoria. Applicants are reminded that there are strict requirements regarding Firearms Licences and firearms registration. Contact your local Police Station, District Firearms Officer or the Victoria Police Firearms Licensing Services for details.
- The minimum age for obtaining a Game Licence is 12 years.
- A 'Junior' aged 12-17 years, can obtain a Game Licence free of charge.

- To avoid delays in processing your application, please ensure that you have provided all of the information required and that all information is correct. The usual turn-around time for Game Licence applications is fifteen working days, (or three weeks), from receipt of your application by the Game Licensing Service, and may be longer in peak periods.
- **Did you know that, having lodged your application, you can 'hunt on your receipt' until you receive your licence in the mail? If you lodge your application in person at a GMA, DELWP or DJPR office, you will be given a receipt so that you can hunt immediately the season opens.**

Responsible Boating

Duck hunting gear such as waders and bulky clothing hinder swimming and buoyancy and when combined with cold air/wind chill, wind, water and/or precipitation, make drowning and hypothermia very real risks for duck hunters. You should not wear waders or bulky clothing in a boat in water greater than standing depth. Personal floatation devices (PDFs) are required to be worn under certain circumstances. Firearm Safety

The GMA endorses the Firearms Safety Code, which was prepared by the Firearms Consultative Committee and promotes safe firearms handling practices. You should know the ten basic safety rules before you handle firearms and insist that anyone who goes shooting with you, follows these rules. If you wish to know more about firearm safety, or obtain a copy of the Firearms Safety Code, contact your local District Firearms Officer.

Game Management Surveys

Each year, GMA surveys hunters on their hunting experience. Surveys may be conducted over the phone or by post, so it is important that your address and telephone number (if provided) is kept up to date. Personal information is handled in accordance with the *Information Privacy Act 2000*.

Information Privacy

The Game Licensing Service of the Game Management Authority (GMA) is committed to protecting your Personal Information according to the principles set out in the *Privacy and Data Protection Act 2014*. This Privacy Statement applies to the collection and use of personal information, voluntarily provided by you, in relation to administration of licences and permits administered under the *Wildlife Act 1975*. A licence or permit may not be issued if the information required on this application form is not provided. You may also apply for access to your personal information at any time to confirm it is accurate and up to date, upon payment of a prescribed fee (if any). The GMA will not discuss your licence or disclose your Personal information to any other person, except by prior arrangement. In certain circumstances, you may require a third-party to make licence enquiries or deal with the GMA on your behalf. A **Proxy Nomination Form** is available from the GMA for this purpose.
