Pacific Black Duck	18 March until 8 June 2026 (inclusive), unless the bag limit is less than 1 in which case there will be no season.	8am until 30 minutes after sunset for first five days of the open season, then 30 minutes before sunrise until 30 minutes after sunset.	TBC –announcement expected in early 2026.	Game ducks can be hunted on some public wetlands and on private land with the permission of the landowner/manager during the open season. Note: wetlands can be closed or hunting further regulated at short notice to protect threatened species, breeding waterbirds or other management reasons.	Shotgun only, not exceeding 12-gauge. Lead shot is prohibited. Hunters are required to use non-toxic shot only . Only approved gundog breeds can be used to hunt ducks. Shotgun only, not exceeding 12 gauge. Lead shot is prohibited. Hunters are required to use non-toxic shot only . Electronic quail callers are prohibited .
